





Weaknesses:

- ♦ We need 28 Classrooms to run all the programmes. But at present, we have only 14 classrooms.
- ✤ Drop out rate is 5%.
- ✤ As the institution is located in the backward area, the socio-economic conditions of the parents are low. Most of the students are from SC,ST, BC and minority categories.
- ✤ Majority of the students are first generation students.

Opportunities:

- This year, JKC Mentor was appointed by CCE, Hyderabad and also Rajiv Yuvakiranalu training program was sanctioned to our college. By using these two opportunities we will enhance the employability skills of the students.
- The institution has meagre dropout rate of 4%. It may be arrested by conducting various need based certificate courses like Tally, Spoken English, and Communication Skills, 'C' Language etc.., which attracts the students towards College.
- By improving basic infrastructure of the college, we will be in a position to enhance the quality education through modernized technology.

Threats:

- As public evinces more interest in technical education the feature of general education is facing several problems. Majority of the intelligent students of the qualifying examination prefer to join Technical courses, like B.Tech and only average or below average pupils only seek admission in general education.

Distribution of medicines for Swine flu for School children of Mandal Parishad Upper Primary School, Chintalapatteda (Vill) near Nagari, by the Department of Economics.

1. GOAL:

Now a days we have been experiencing totally new types of diseases. Swine flu is one of such dieses found adversely affecting human life. So as a precautionary measure it is decided to distribute medicines for Swine flu to the students of MPUP School in nearby village to this Institution.

2. The context:

When the viral fever Swine flu is wide spread, the attendance of the school children is low. The fever can be prevented if some precautionary measures are taken. The students and their parents are from rural areas and not aware of many diseases including Swine flu and other viral infections. So to bring awareness among students, parents and Teachers to deal with this viral disease, a programme was conducted.

3. Practice:

We have explained about the symptoms of Swine flu to the students, parents and teachers so that they can identify the fever in the children in advance. We have given them the medicines & explained the method of usage of the medicine. Whenever teacher finds the symptoms of Swine flu, they can give the medicines to the students before the health condition deteriorates.

4. Evidence of Success:

The students, parents and teachers came to know about the Swine flu fever and its symptoms after the programme. After the programme, when we visited the school, they informed that the spread of Swine flu is controlled among the School children. So the programme has good success rate.

5. Problems encountered:

At the beginning, the students and parents were hesitant about the efficacy of the medicine and afraid of the side effects. Later, taking the initiation and encouragement from the teachers, we could overcome the problem of distribution of medicine.

6. NOTE:

We have brought awareness about different kinds of viral fevers to the school children and basic easy methods to prevent attack of diseases and to keep good health.

BEST PRACTICES

Training of Women students in floral arrangement:

This training of decoration, beautification, bouquet making is undertaken by the Women empowerment cell in the Institution.

1. Goal:

The main object of this practice is they can keep their homes clean, tidy and in a well decorated way. We feel that making women students aware of home decoration, beautification, bouquet making is the first priority and remains for lifelong. Hence we taught the women students the technique and the methods of floral arrangement. It also creates and aesthetic sense in their households. This training also creates an opportunity for them to exploit their skill for commercial purpose.

2. The Context:

Since the students come from rural poor and illiterate background, they may not be aware of many things that are related to richness. Beautification and decoration, housekeeping are such practices related to rich people. Today's girls are tomorrow's home makers. Therefore it is thought that if these skills are taught to them, they may benefit from the skills in future. Hence it is decided to take up training the women students in floral arrangement.

3. Practice:

The women students are asked to collect various types of flowers available from their surroundings, both wild and grown in gardens. In response this and the students brought many varieties of flowers. The women Faculty of the Women empowerment cell taught them the techniques of floral arrangement and bouquet making. These skills were used when the students made floral arrangement for the two Seminars conducted in the institution.

4. Evidence of success:

The students were enthusiastic throughout their training period. All the floral arrangement s made during the Seminars and the flower bouquets handed over to the Dignitaries are prepared by the students. This arrangement saved the Seminar Organizers thousands of rupees. Many people appreciated the efforts taken by the students in the Stage and Seminar hall floral arrangement.

5. Problems encountered:

In the beginning the students were very slow in learning as they hail from a rural background. But women are naturally adept in learning flower arrangement techniques. This floral arrangement skill is taught in cities only and the art belong to urban areas. But as the students have shown much patience and developed the flower arrangement skills.

6. Note:

It is one of the efforts of the Women empowerment cell to create a dignified way of teaching a skill a skill to women students to exploit the skill for commercial skill.

FEED BACK ANALYSIS

A total of 100 Students, Parents and Alumni are given different questionnaires and feedback is taken from them.

1. STUDENTS:
