SWOT Analysis:

Strengths:

- ❖ We have sufficient land with an extent of 17.16 acres.
- ❖ The institution has own building.
- ❖ The Institution has total number of 736 students in Nine (UG:08 + PG:01) Courses.
- ❖ Apart from Conventional Courses, we have restructured courses like B.Com (Computer Applications and B.Sc (MPCs). We are also having UGC Add-on courses (Web Design and Computer Networking). The College also offering Certificate Courses like Tally, PC Software and 'C'-Language, Spoken English and Communication Skills.
- ❖ The Institution has 30 sanctioned posts in which 24 members are Regular Lecturers and 03 member is Contract Faculty. Among the faculty working in the Institution, 12 members are having Ph.D Degree, 7 members are having M.Phil Degree. 5 members of the Staff are NET/SLET qualified.
- ❖ College conducts Add-on Courses in Web Design, Computer Networking, 'C'- Language which promotes the student skills suitable to present job markets.
- ❖ For the last three academic years this Institution secured highest marks award in Mathematics.

Weaknesses:

- ❖ We need 24 Classrooms to run all the programmes. But at present, we have only 15 classrooms. Labs are also used for Class room teaching.
- ❖ Drop out rate is 5%.
- ❖ As the institution is located in the backward area, the socio-economic conditions of the parents are low. Most of the students are from SC,ST, BC and minority categories.

- ❖ Majority of the students are first generation students.

Opportunities:

- ❖ This year, JKC Mentor was appointed by CCE, Hyderabad to enhance the employability skills of the students.
- ❖ The institution has meagre dropout rate of 5%. It may be arrested by conducting various need based certificate courses like Tally, Spoken English, and Communication Skills, ‘C’ Language etc., which attracts the students towards College.
- ❖ By improving basic infrastructure of the college, we will be in a position to enhance the quality education through modernized technology.

Threats:

- ❖ As public evinces more interest in technical education the feature of general education is facing several problems. Majority of the intelligent students of the qualifying examination prefer to join Technical courses, like B.Tech and only average or below average pupils only seek admission in general education.

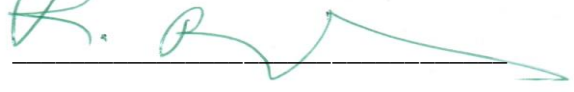

“HELMET AWARENESS CAMPAIGN BY STUDENTS OF B.A. UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF RRC & DRC COORDINATOR”

1. GOAL:

As the College is situated on the National Highway (Tirupati – Chennai), the students witness many accidents of two wheel riders. This Campaign aims at reducing the deaths on the Highways due to not wearing of Helmet and over speeding. This campaign teaches the value of life of breadwinner in the family and the loss due to his death in accidents.

2. The context:

Sometime during the middle of the Academic Year our College student and his father involved and gravely injured in two wheeler accident near the College premises. Most of the students and staff visited the hospital and took the decision to start an awareness campaign for wearing Helmets and avoiding speeding of Cars and other large vehicles to avoid further accidents near our College.

3. Practice:

We have explained about the benefits and safety of wearing Helmets on regular basis when the two wheelers ride on the town roads or Highways. The students periodically stopped the two wheel riders without Helmet passing by the College on the Highway and clearly explained them and their family members to insist on wearing Helmets. The Local police also cooperated and appreciated the practice.

4. Evidence of Success:

The students, parents and teachers came to know about the importance of benefit of wearing Helmets and thereby saving not only their lives but also protecting their family members. They realised that once life is lost in

the accident, nothing can be done and dependent family will suffer in many ways in the society. Many people appreciated the efforts made by the Students and started wearing Helmets in the nearby town. So the campaign can be taken as complete success.

5. Problems encountered:

At the beginning, many two wheel riders felt offensive to stop their vehicle and to tell them to wear Helmet. Many two wheelers did not stop their vehicle to listen to the student's advice. Some turned aggressive, but later after some persuasion everybody realised the importance of the Helmet campaign.

6. NOTE:

We have brought awareness about wearing Helmets regularly irrespective of the roads in which they are travelling. The road may be village gravel road or National Highway, but wearing Helmet is best for their safety and their family.

FEED BACK ANALYSIS

A total of 100 Students, Parents and Alumni are given different questionnaires and feedback is taken from them. The results are analysed as below.

1. PARENTS:

Most of the parents belong to the Agriculture labourers and only a few are self employed. Majority of the parents expressed that the Courses offered and facilities in the College are useful to their wards. They also expressed good opinion about the Infrastructure facilities available in the Institution. They also expressed that implementation of reservations in the admissions is good. Regarding safety of Women students and implementation of anti ragging measures is good. All the Parents felt that Government Scholarships and Poor boy's fund implemented good. All the parents expressed good opinion regarding transport, sanitation and drinking water facilities in the Institution. Parents expressed that t their ward's overall performance is good in the Institution during their period of study.

2. STUDENTS:

Year after Year this college has acquired good infrastructure facilities. So, 80% of the students expressed those facilities regarding class rooms and infrastructure is good.
