From 12-08-2024 to 06-09-2024

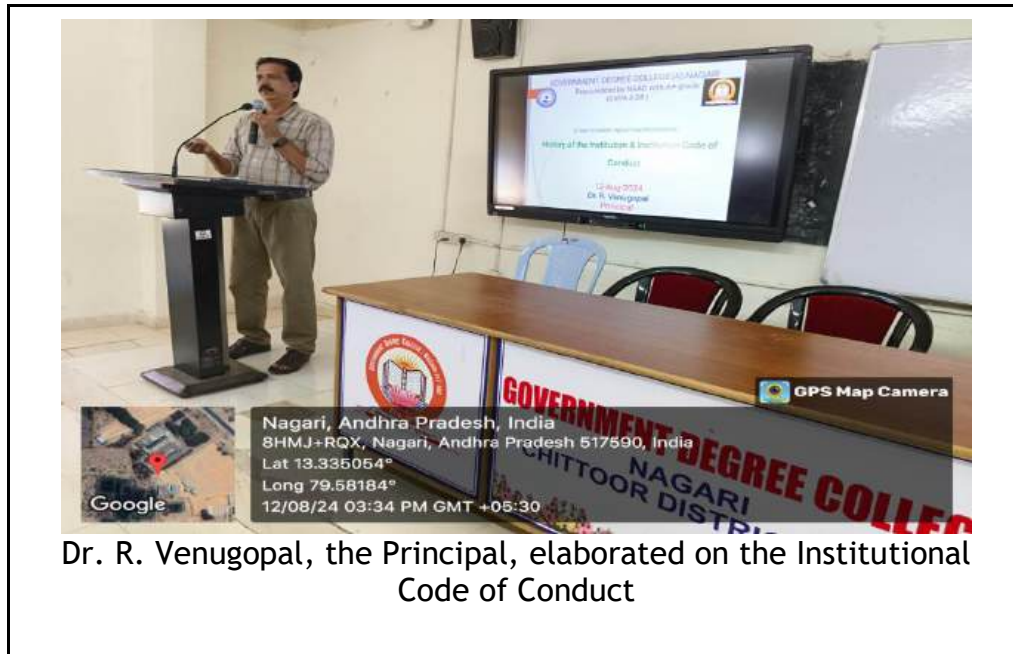
The 21-Day Student Induction Programme at Government Degree College (Autonomous) from 12th August 2024 to 6th September 2024 was a comprehensive and engaging orientation programme designed as per the guidelines of the Commissioner of Collegiate education, to introduce newly admitted students to the academic, cultural, and administrative framework of the institution. This programme was meticulously organized to offer insights into the college history, its functioning, and various support mechanisms available to students, aligning with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.



SESSIONS

Code of Conduct:

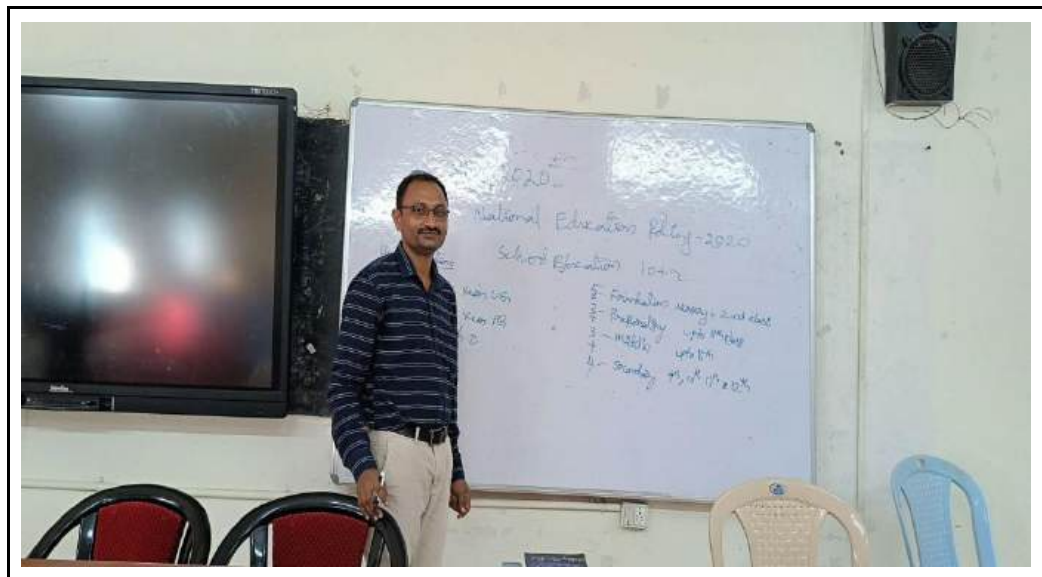
After the formal inaugural session of the programme on 12-08-2024, The programme began with a keynote address by Dr. R. Venugopal, Principal of the institution, who highlighted the rich history of the institutions, its milestones, like NAAC A+, Autonomous Status that underscore its journey toward becoming a Center of Excellence in future. He also elaborated on the Institutional Code of Conduct, emphasizing the importance of discipline, academic integrity, and a conducive learning environment. This session set the tone for students, stressing the values, the college stands for the standards of behavior and academic performance.

National Education Policy and CBCS:

In subsequent sessions, **Dr. M. Bhaskara Raju**, Vice-principal and Lecturer in **Political Science** outlined the significance of NEP 2020, which focuses on holistic education. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) at the undergraduate level was thoroughly explained, highlighting how students could choose a combination of subjects based on their interests.



Continuous Internal Assessment:

Students were introduced to the system of Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA), designed to ensure that learning is a continuous process. **Dr. P. Maheswari, Academic Coordinator and Lecturer in Statistics**, enlightened the students on CIA.



Single Major System in Undergraduation:

In the following session, **Dr. M. Reddi Naik, Lecturer in Commerce**, introduced the Single Major system at the undergraduate level, emphasizing its benefits for students. He explained how this new system allows for more focused and in-depth study within a chosen subject area, enabling students to develop a deeper understanding and mastery of their field. He also highlighted how this specialized approach develops critical thinking and subject expertise, which can be advantageous in both academic pursuits and future career opportunities. He also pointed out that the Single Major system aligns with National education standards, providing students with a competitive edge. Furthermore, He explained how this structure offers greater flexibility in aligning academic goals with career aspirations, ultimately preparing students for specialized roles in their chosen industries.



CSP, Short Term Internship, Semester Internship:

Dr.M.Revathi, Lecturer in English gave awareness on the Community Service Project, short-term Internship, Semester Internships and their role in shaping the students as a part of completion of the graduation. She further claimed that these activities provide opportunities to enhance their skills alongside academics. These programmes are mandatory. They were presented as key to gaining practical experience and building industry connections.



Multi-Disciplinary and Skill Enhancement Courses:

In the following day's session, **Dr. P. Venugopal, Lecturer in Commerce**, and **Dr. J. Girish Kumar, Lecturer in Mathematics**, presented an overview of the various multi-disciplinary and skill enhancement courses offered by the college. They emphasized how these courses provide students with the opportunity to explore subjects beyond their major, encouraging a well-rounded academic experience. By integrating disciplines from various fields, students are able to develop a diverse skill set that is highly relevant to the demands of the modern job market. Dr. Venugopal highlighted the importance of these courses in promoting adaptability, creativity, and problem-solving abilities. They explained how students can apply these additional skills in various professional contexts, broadening their career prospects. The session underscored the college's commitment to offering a holistic education that goes beyond traditional subject boundaries, preparing students for both academic success and real-world challenges.



Grievances and Redressal Cell, Anti-Ragging Cell:

Coordinators of Grievances and Redressal Cell, Anti-Ragging Cell Coordinators, **Dr. C. Chinnapamma, Lecturer in Telugu** and **Sri. D. Ramanjulu, Lecturer in Economics** introduced the concept of grievances within the college campus and the mechanism for the redressal of those grievances. They tried to bring awareness on problems and solution methods so that newly joined students would get clarity on the decent behaviour within the college. They educated the students on the ragging problem and its effects on peers. It is firmly told that ragging is punishable and it is prohibited in and around the campus.



Online/ Certification courses:

Sri. P. Naveen, Lecturer in Chemistry, conducted an insightful session on the importance of online certification courses, highlighting how they provide students with opportunities to pursue additional qualifications through reputable digital platforms. He explained that these courses allow students to enhance their knowledge and skills in specific areas of interest, all while maintaining flexibility in their schedules. By successfully completing these certifications, students can not only deepen their expertise but also earn recognized credentials that can significantly strengthen their resumes. He emphasized how these certifications can give students a competitive edge in securing internships and placements, as they demonstrate initiative and a commitment to continuous learning. The session encouraged students to explore various online platforms to supplement their academic journey and improve their employability.



Library Visit:

Mr. Siva Kumar, Librarian explained the students on the different types of sections the books are placed in and guided them on the pattern of borrowing and returning of the books for their learning.

Students are encouraged to visit the library often to build good reading habits, which are important for their learning and growth. By looking at different books, they can learn new ideas and better understand their subjects. This also helps them think more deeply and improve their problem-solving skills. Visiting the library gives students the chance to explore new topics and grow their knowledge. It's a great place for learning on their own, encouraging curiosity and a love for reading that can last a lifetime.



Online feedback system for Curriculum and Teaching Methodologies:

Dr. A. Indira Priyadarsini, IQAC Coordinator and Lecturer in Botany, explained the online feedback system for curriculum and teaching methodologies, emphasizing its role in enhancing the learning process. She highlighted how the system empowers students to provide constructive feedback on various academic aspects, ensuring their voices are heard in shaping educational quality. Dr. Priyadarsini emphasized that student input plays a crucial role in refining teaching strategies, course content, and overall learning experiences. By actively participating, students contribute to continuous improvements in the institution's academic offerings.



Awareness on FRS/Biometric systems, Scholarships, Student Responsibilities, Jnanabhumi, and Vidya Deevana:

The programme covered important topics such as FRS/Biometric systems, Scholarships, Student Responsibilities, Jnanabhumi, and Vidya Deevana. The session began with a presentation by **Dr. A. Sri Lakshmi, Lecturer in Computer Applications**, who emphasized the responsibilities of students regarding their conduct and timely responses to official communications issued by the Principal, various committee coordinators, and office staff.



Next, Smt. K. Uma Maheswari, Lecturer in Computer Science, provided a detailed explanation of the Facial Recognition System (FRS), Jnanabhumi, and the Biometric attendance system. She instructed the students to register on the Jnanabhumi platform, noting that attendance will be tracked daily through the FRS in the Jnanabhumi app. She also stressed the necessity of maintaining a minimum of 75% attendance, which is required for eligibility to sit for university examinations and to claim government scholarships. She urged all students to attend classes regularly.



Student Scholarships: and Vidya Deevana Scheme:

Sri. G. S. Ravi, Superintendent, from the office, provided insights into student scholarships and the Vidya Deevana scheme. He informed the students that all eligible candidates may apply for scholarships by providing necessary documentation.



Student Support Wings: Women Empowerment Cell/Eco-club/ Cultural Club:

Student support wings, including the Women Empowerment Cell (WEC), and Eco-Club, Cultural Club were introduced to provide platforms for student welfare and involvement.

Dr. A. Indira Priyadarsini, Lecturer in Botany, WEC Coordinator, educated girl students on a range of important women-related issues. She provided guidance on appropriate campus conduct, highlighting the importance of maintaining a respectful and secure environment for female students. She also emphasized the significance of personal hygiene and its role in overall well-being, offering practical tips and advice. Through the WEC, she encouraged female students to engage in discussions on gender issues, empowerment, and self-care, while the other clubs were introduced to foster environmental awareness, cultural engagement, and leadership development. These initiatives aim to create a supportive and enriching campus experience for all students.



Eco-Club and Cultural Club:

Dr. M. Aruna Kumari, Coordinator of the Eco-Club and Cultural Club and Lecturer in Botany, encouraged students to actively participate in cultural activities as a means of enhancing their overall learning experience. She highlighted that engaging in such activities not only fosters creativity but also promotes teamwork and collaboration among peers. Dr. Kumari emphasized that cultural events can invigorate students, helping them to stay active and energetic throughout their academic journey. By participating in performances, art exhibitions, and community projects, students can develop valuable skills and build lasting connections. She also pointed out that these experiences contribute to a vibrant campus culture, where diversity and expression are celebrated. Dr. Kumari's encouragement aimed to inspire students to embrace the full

spectrum of their college experience, balancing academics with artistic and cultural pursuits.

Heritage and Culture:

In another session **Dr. Tirumala Vasudeva Rao, Lecturer in History**, highlighted the rich history and vibrant culture of India, particularly focusing on Andhra Pradesh. He emphasized how Andhra's contributions to language, art, and architecture have shaped Indian heritage. The importance of preserving these traditions and understanding their relevance in modern times was discussed, and developed a sense of pride and responsibility among the students.



Parent Teacher Meeting(PTM)

Sri. B. Subramanyam, Lecturer in Zoology, created awareness on the importance of parent-teacher meetings in the college. He said that it helped both the teacher and parents to understand how well the student is doing in studies and/or if there are any issues like behavior problems of the student.



E-Learning/ ICT/ Learning Management System (LMS):

Dr. A. Sri Lakshmi, Lecturer in Computer Applications, created awareness to the students regarding the use of ICT by the faculty to enhance the quality of Teaching, Learning and Evaluation. She also explained about the ICT facilities available in the college, like, digital classrooms and virtual classroom, Projectors, and computer labs. She said that the students should get well versed with using these ICT facilities available to improve their presentation skills. All the students are informed to use the digital classrooms, virtual classroom and computer labs for preparing and presenting their PowerPoint presentations, reports of their community Service project, 2-months internship and the 6-months internship.

Smt. K. Uma Maheswari, Lecturer in Computer Science, spoke on E-learning and introduced the CCE LMS, which contains the E-content in 4 quadrants i.e. PowerPoint presentations, videos, lecture notes and MCQs which can be easily accessed by the

students and act as a wonderful resource of E-Learning. Students were also enlightened about ICT based evaluation using plickers, Quizizz , Testmoz etc.



Jawahar Knowledge Centre:

Dr. M. Pankaja, JKC and Placement Coordinator gave awareness on training and Placement activities in the campus. She said that JKC wing trains the students on various job related skills such as Arithmetic and Reasoning, Computer Skills and Communication and Soft Skills. JKC FTM Mr.Lal Basha briefed on job drives and online Microsoft certificate courses.





Career Guidance Cell:

Career Guidance Cell Coordinator **Dr. M. Revathi** created awareness on various Career and Higher Education opportunities after graduation. She focused and enlightened on opportunities for B.A, B.COM and B.SC respectively.



NCC and NSS:

National Cadet Corps (NCC) and National Service Scheme (NSS), coordinators **Dr. D. Bhaskar** and **Dr. E. Gopi**, Lecturers in Commerce respectively emphasized on the importance of joining NCC and NSS. They exclaimed that involving in NSS activities and NCC activities help in building leadership, discipline, and social responsibility. NCC

offers military training and promotes national unity, while NSS encourages community service, developing empathy and civic engagement. Both programs help students to become all-rounded and socially conscious individuals.



Health and Hygiene:

Dr. G. Swathi, Lecturer in Zoology, educated students on personal hygiene and wellness, emphasizing the importance of maintaining a balanced and healthy lifestyle. She introduced the campus health services and resources available to students, providing an overview of essential support systems. During her session, she explained practical steps for developing healthy habits, including nutrition, exercise, and regular health check-ups. Additionally, Dr. Swathi addressed stress management techniques, highlighting methods such as mindfulness, time management, and relaxation exercises to cope with academic pressures.



Digital Initiatives by CCE:

Dr. B. Ramesh, Lecturer in Physics, created awareness on the CCE's and college's digital initiatives that had brought for the benefit of students. He highlighted how these initiatives have significantly enhanced access to educational resources, enabling students to pursue academic growth and career planning with greater ease. He showcased the digital tools and platforms that support learning, skill development, and professional preparedness. He emphasized the importance of leveraging these resources for self-paced learning, online certifications, and interactive coursework. Additionally, he pointed out how CEJP (job portal app) helping students stay competitive in the job market. His presentation underscored the college's commitment to integrating technology into education, thereby providing students with invaluable opportunities for their future.



Sports and Games:

Sports and Games were conducted to emphasize the importance of physical fitness and overall well-being. **Mr. Prem, Physical director** conducted sports and games for students. Boys and Girls participated in 200 mts running. A mass **drill** was designed for girl students and monitored by **Dr. M. Revathi and Dr. M. Pankaja Lecturers in English**. All these activities enhance body coordination, stamina, and mental alertness among students. These activities aimed at promoting a healthy lifestyle, teamwork, and discipline among students. The session motivated students to incorporate fitness routines into their daily schedules.
